Shamwari Safaris are delighted to announce that we will be primarily based at Rufunsa GMA concession area that will be available to clients from next season.

Working in conjunction with Nyampala Safaris this area has been re opened to hunters to promote sustainable habitat and responsible wildlife utilisation. Shamwari Safaris will still be able to use other areas should client's require different species not available in the Rufunsa.

The game is plentiful and some amazing trophies have already been viewed.

The concession is situated alongside the Zambezi River and escarpment, at the confluence of the Luangwa and Zambezi Valley.

With vegetation being typically Mopani woodland and thick Jesse bush, the area is both mountainous and makes the hunting both challenging and VERY exciting.

The camp will consist of 3 permanent chalets with a lapa area and dining room. It promises to be wonderfully comfortable and the views over the Zambezi are magnificent.



Over the last few weeks we have spent lots of time exploring the area, and with the help of stealth cameras have managed to capture a wonderful variety of game that will be available to us next year.

For bird enthusiasts, there are two types of guinea fowl available for shooting, the helmeted and the crested. With different species of Franklin and water fowl.

A truly diverse area to explore!

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We are most excited about the presence of some fantastic Leopards, some really big Toms have been sighted and we have a full quota still available for next year.

Getting to the concession could not be easier, it's a short 5 hour drive from the capital Lusaka, or an even shorter 30 min charter flight!



In addition to the trophy hunting, the fishing is really good as well. Lots of prime tiger fish (season depending) and a perfect way to unwind

The confluence of the Luangwa and Zambezi river is known as the breeding area for a large variety of fish, a trip to the local Harbour is always incredibly interesting to see the diversity from the one river. As a bigger plus, fresh fish is available in camp most days!!

For those of you that are keen on your history, 500metres from base camp is the site of the Operation Turmoil which included the Selous Scouts and SAS and is more commonly known locally as the battle of Kavalamanja.

Shamwari Safaris is excited to have the use of this area going forward, and it will yield some superb hunting for clients going forward.
